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## January Executive Board Report

The TCBA Board of Directors met at the Foster Community Center on January 4, 2005. Board members present included Arnie Johnson, Susan Viele, Ron Claflin, Charla Scheidler, Darryl Burris, Kori Sperling and Ed Usewick. Also present were club members Cheryl Claflin, Katie Donnelly, Dick Janson, Lenny Provencher and Dwayne Scheidler.

#### **Discussion items/Announcements**

Arnie reported on a suggestion that he received from a member regarding putting together a safety video to show at rides and distribute to public TV. It was suggested that LAB may already have this type of information available and more research will be done before a decision is made.

Steve Widder presented his thoughts on holding a Bike Expo. Details are not finalized yet but more information will follow as it is developed.

Darryl Burris reported that DALMAC committees have been meeting and plans are underway. This year we will have a Quint route, combined with the Quad route to eliminate resources needed to run an extra route.

### Action items

Minutes of the December meeting were approved with one correction. The correction being a clarification on counting cumulative mileage for the ride incentive program. Mileage will only be recognized in the year that it is ridden, it cannot be carried over to a future year and combined with mileage for that year.

Ron Claflin presented a financial report through December 29<sup>th</sup>, 2004, as well as a budged for 2005. Both were approved as presented.

Dwayne Scheidler reported on the status of a meeting he and Arnie attended with the club attorney, James Duby, regarding the use of the name Woman on Wheels for our annual bicycle ride. A woman's motorcycle club in St. Paul, MN has asked that we cease the use of the name. The board authorized Dwayne to pursue the matter to justify our right to the use of the name.

Mileage reimbursement for volunteers that need to travel for TCBA business was discussed and it was decided that TCBA would make it a policy to reimburse members an amount equal to what the Federal standards are.

Dick Janson presented his recent work on Crosstown Bicycle Routes and volunteered to continue to work on the project if it was felt that it was valid. The board agreed that Dick's efforts were on target and approved an expenditure of approx. \$200 for software needed to develop the maps, as well as reimbursement for longdistance charges.

Arnie informed the board that there have been two recent instances where members have expressed an interest in using hard shell bike travel cases if TCBA were to purchase some. It was agreed that Arnie should pursue costs involved to purchase two.

## E A S Y S P O K E N Crosstown Bike Routes

Want to get across

Lansing on your bike, but don't like riding on busy roads?

This Spring, TCBA plans to create, print, and distribute maps that will show you how to do just that.

Busy roads are often the fastest, and most direct, way to get somewhere. That's why they are busy. But they are not very much fun to ride.

If you are willing to take no more than an extra 10 minutes, and ride at least 10mph, you will be able to stay off the 24 busiest roads in the Lansing area 80-90% of the time.

For instance, you will be able to go from the Meijer on South Cedar to the Meijer on Lake Lansing Road and avoid 92% of the busiest roads. It will cost you an extra 8 minutes.

Going east to west, between Okemos and Lansing Mall Meijers, is still pretty good, with 80% avoidance costing 11 extra minutes. Yea, I know I said 10 minutes, but at 11mph it becomes less than 10 minutes.

Along those lines, from Lansing Mall to Lake Lansing Road Meijers, it may take an extra 12 minutes, but you will avoid 97% of the busiest roads.

Take a minute or two to think about it. It really isn't that long. Besides, when you are enjoying a quiet ride, the last thing you want to do is shorten it!

Now, think of the possibilities. You will be able to go places you might now feel uncomfortable with. You can go twice as far if you catch a bike-rack-equipped CATA bus back to your start. Their racks even hold bikes with flat tires and bike riders who want to avoid a storm.

You can ride the CATA bus into the wind, and have the wind at your back coming home. You can ride your bike to go shopping, and take the CATA bus home with your packages.

You can ride to the start of more club rides, earning more incentive points.

You can commute back and forth between work.

There will be some good riding days between now and Mid-April. I'll be setting up some "D" rides that include the new routes. I want to see how others like them and get suggestions for improvements. Watch the TCBA Called-in ride line.

If you are a novice, or a commuter, please help evaluate these routes. If you are just curious and like to be among the first know about things, join us.

The maps will be free and abundant. The TCBA Board has given its enthusiastic support to this project, both in words and financial backing.

Getting from one place to another on your bike will soon be even more fun.

The mission of the Kids Repair Program is to provide positive experiences and educational opportunities in bicycle safety, repair and maintenance for youth in the Lansing area.

The Kids Repair Program is a 501(c)(3), non-profit organization teaching bike safety, repair and maintenance to students 9-17 years of age. The program is split into three levels of instruction: the Basics level teaches problem recognition, the Intermediate level teaches how to fix the problem, and the Advanced level improves skills and provides students with options for fixing the problem.

This ongoing neighborhood volunteer project requires an application of permission by a parent or guardian for acceptance into the program. Once a student's application is approved, an orientation and registration session is held to provide information to the students and their parents/guardians. Classes with planned lessons are taught and supervised by certified volunteer instructors. Each student is provided 20 hours of class instruction and receives a "Certificate of Achievement" upon completing the course.

Area residents, police, clergy and city officials observed the positive changes in the neighborhood and the enthusiasm of the children. The Lansing Police Department began donating bicycles and bike helmets to the project. The Tri-County Bicycle Association and The DALMAC Fund have been generous in their support of the program.

In 1998, by networking with other area agencies, "Grandad" was able to relocate the bike program to its present location at Impression 5 Science Center.

Office hours are Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9 am - 8pm. Class hours during the school year are 4:30 - 7:30 pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays. During the summer, class hours are either 9 am -12 noon or 1 - 4 pm.

Kids enrolled in the program provide their own bicycle if they have one. An assessment is made to see if the bicycle is repairable. If the bicycle is not repairable, the student will be assigned a bike that they may take home upon completing the class. Students will also receive a new bike helmet and bike lock.

Students are given 20 hours of instruction in bicycle safety, repair and maintenance. Upon completion, a graduation ceremony is held and a "Certificate of Achievement" is awarded.

## CPSC, Norco Products Ltd. Announce Recall of Bicycle Attachment



WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission announces the following recall in

voluntary cooperation with the firm below. Consumers should stop using recalled products immediately unless otherwise instructed.

**Name of product**: Adams Trail-a-Bike or Adams Slipstream Bicycle Attachment

Units: About 80,000

Importer: Norco Products Ltd., of British Columbia, Canada

**Hazard**: The hardware used in the assembly of the universal hitch may come loose causing the unit to separate from the lead bicycle, which could lead to a serious injury or death to the rider of the bicycle attachment.

**Incidents/Injuries**: Norco Products has received two reports of hardware falling out of the hitch assembly. One minor injury reported.

**Description**: The recall involves the Adams Trail-A-Bike or Adams Slipstream sold under the following models: Starter, Folder, Shifter, Shocker, Ultimate Tandem, Deluxe Folder, Me 2 and Original. "Trail-A-Bike" or "Slipstream" is printed on the top tube of the bicycle attachment and "Adams" is printed on the chain guard. The product resembles a children's bicycle without a front wheel and has an elongated top tube that stretches to attach to the seat post of an adult bicycle, creating a tandem. The product was sold for use by children ages 4 to 7.

**Sold at**: Independent bicycle stores nationwide from January 1996 through October 2004 for between \$125 to \$295

### Manufactured in: China

**Remedy**: Consumers should immediately stop using the product and contact their local bicycle dealer to arrange for an inspection and to receive a no charge repair kit to be installed for free.
