# MINUTES OF THE TRI-COUNTY BICYCLE ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Foster Community Center - Lansing October 7, 2008

Board members present included Joe Adams, Sue Viele, Linda Antinori, Al Simons, Dick Sulin, Herb Drake, and Kris Stairs. Also present were club members Katie Donnelly, Dick Janson, Lee Adair, Curt "Granddad" Eure, Ken Hendrick, Bill Savage, Patricia Trudgen, and Janet Weber.

#### Reports

- 1. President's Report: Joe Adams, President, called the meeting to order at 6:28 PM.
- Minutes/Secretary's Report: Minutes of the September meeting were presented for review by Linda Antinori, Secretary. After grammatical corrections were made to the minutes, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Sue Viele and seconded by Dick Sulin. The motion passed unanimously.
- Treasurer's Report: Dick Sulin, Treasurer, presented the September Financial Reports to the Board for review. A motion to pass the Financial Reports was made by Herb Drake, seconded by Linda Antinori and passed unanimously.
- 4. <u>Events Director</u>: Al Simons reported that initial DALMAC tallies indicate that this year's numbers are comparable to last year's figures. There are still some bills to be paid before final results can be tabulated. He also asked the Board's permission to send 4 people to the NBTD meeting at a cost of \$1200 per person. Sue Viele made a motion to approve the expenditure which Kris Stairs seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 4 ayes, 1nay, and 1 abstaining.
- 5. <u>DALMAC Fund</u>: Joe Adams has been unable to contact Tom Hardenbergh about the status of the DAL-MAC Fund applications. He will try to resolve this issue via letter before the next Board meeting.
- **6.** <u>Ride Committee</u>: Kris Stairs announced that the Ride Committee would meet October 21 to review Ride Incentive Program rules and the club jersey design.

#### **Old Business:**

- Linda Antinori will try to get an election committee together by May 2009 so we can more effectively recruit Club members to run for office.
- Al Simon made a motion that the TCBA make a donation of \$1 for each rider on DALMAC, WOW, and T-Shirt Rides to the League of Michigan Bicyclists for their advocacy projects. Sue Viele seconded the motion and it passed by a vote of 5 ayes and 1 nay.
- Discussion was held on looking into having one source to do everything on the web page and to remind everyone that it is a work in progress. Herb is to look into costs on the subject and the possibility of having a Web Coordinator to oversee the web page. We are still looking for someone to replace Ed Noonan as Web Master.
- Linda Antinori reported that the cost of having name tags done by local engraving shops varied from \$8 to \$17 per name tag, plus a one time set up fee of up to \$90. It was decided to check into the cost of silk screening the name tags or possibly buying our own engraving machine.
- Joe Adams announced that the Blue Map Book is at the printers and the cost is \$3.20 per map book.
- Lee Adair presented a proposal to the Board to standardize the bicycle flag length on the flags used on Club
  multi-day rides to 6 feet from the center of the axle to the top of the flag starting with the 2009 riding season.
  Dick Sulin made a motion to accept the proposal and Sue Viele seconded the motion. It passed by a vote of
  5 ayes and 1 nay.

#### **New Business:**

Ken Hendrick and Dick Sulin made a proposal to move the club's three bank accounts out over three different banks to assure they are fully insured. The Board concurred that it would be a prudent move.

- Dick Janson submitted a proposal to the Board asking for \$5,000 for the Share-A-Bike Program which supplies bikes and helmets to those who would not otherwise be able to afford them. The bulk of the money would go to purchase 300 helmets, with the rest being used for supplies. Al Simon made a proposal to give the money to the Share-A-Bike Program which Dick Sulin seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- Joe Adams asked the board to submit to him via email nominations for Volunteer of the Year. Ballots for Ride Leader of the Year will be placed in November's Chainwheel Chatter and can be returned via mail to the Club Post Office box.
- Bill Savage, Safety and Education Committee, informed the Board of two Class I LCI trainings to be held in October. One in Algonac and the other in Grand Rapids. Both are being offered for a lesser cost than we were able to do so. He also asked for Board approval to hold a LCI Class One in May which the Board agreed to.
- The Board Transition dinner will be held Tuesday, December 9, at 6 p.m. at a location to be announced. Sue Viele will let us know of the location.

#### Member Input:

- Curt "Granddad" Eure asked the Board for a contribution of \$3,200 for his program to cover insurance costs, tires for their van, and accountant fees. He was asked if he had submitted a proposal to the DAL-MAC Fund Committee and Granddad replied 'yes'. His proposal was tabled until the next Board meeting with the hope of his project getting approval from the DALMAC Fund Committee.
- Dick Janson was asked if Share-A-Bike had submitted a proposal to The DALMAC Fund for their needed funding. He informed the Board that they had indeed submitted one. Al Simon then made a motion to rescind his previous motion concerning funding Share-A-Bike. The vote was 4 aye, 1 abstaining, and 1 nay. The Board will reconsider both Dick's and Granddad's proposals if they are not funded by The DAL-MAC Fund.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:32 p.m.

# BOB GIBBS RIDES DALMAC BICYCLE TOUR QUAD CENTURY ROUTE AT AGE 90 By Kenneth Hendrick

Bob Gibbs, who retired from the DNR Engineering Division in 1980, rode the DALMAC Bicycle Tour Quad Century route shortly before turning 90 years old on September 7, 2008. DALMAC consists of 5, four and five-day bicycle tours that go from Lansing to Mackinaw City or DeTour, ending the day before Labor Day each year. One of these routes consists of four 100+ mile days, the most difficult of the five routes. Bob, who had been the DALMAC Director in 1980, wanted

to celebrate his 90<sup>th</sup> birthday by completing this route.

Bob, who was born in Mayfield, Michigan in 1918, served with the Army 5<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division in Iceland and Europe for five years during World War II. After the War, he attended Michigan State University, graduating in 1951. He went to work for the Conservation Department Forestry Division in 1954. Bob became part of the Engineering Division when it was first organized in the 1960's.

We currently have 523 individual memberships and 284 family memberships with 2 or more people per household for a total of 1328 members. We updated and printed 200 Lansing Area Bicycle Map Booklets for dis-

tribution to new members.

#### **DALMAC: AI Simons**

For DALMAC 2008 we increased the rider population of the 4-West and 5-Day (Petoskey) routes from 500 to 575 riders each. This increase allowed enrollment for all routes to stay open much longer. As in 2007, these routes closed several weeks after the opening of DAL-MAC enrollment. This increase also relieved rider's frustrations of having their favorite route full when they went to sign up for DALMAC. Another change for DALMAC 2008 was the addition of 3 new overnight stops. The cities and villages of Vestaburg, Bullock Creek, and Boyne City hosted us. During and after DALMAC I received very positive reports from riders, crew, and our new hosts. This was the second year for the 5-UP route where its riders must cross the Mackinac Bridge to get to the final destination of De Tour Village in the Upper Peninsula. The total rider count for DALMAC 2008 was 2145, down 100 from 2007. The steep price of gasoline caused a lot of economic strife last summer which probably contributed to the slow down in enrollment. During the tour, the volunteers encountered several problems and did an outstanding job managing them. It's the volunteers who make DALMAC such a success each year.

#### Rides & Mileage's: Steve Schuesler

Steve collects the ride sheets that are submitted by the ride leaders and enters the information into the ride database. He makes sure the ride mileage is placed on our web site for all to view.

Shimano American Corp. Recalls Wheels for Bicycles; Flat Tire Can Pose Injury Risk to Riders

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with the firm named below, today announced a voluntary recall of the following consumer product. Consumers should stop using recalled products immediately unless otherwise instructed.

Name of Product: Shimano Dura Ace Carbon Clincher Wheels for Bicycles

Units: About 275

Importer: Shimano American Corp., of Irving, Calif. Manufacturer: Shimano Components SDN, of Johor, Malaysia.

Hazard: Rim surface and spoke hole plugs on the wheel can cause a puncture to the inner tube, resulting in a flat

tire. This can cause the rider to lose control and fall.

Incidents/Injuries: None reported.

Description: This recall involves the Shimano Dura Ace Carbon Clincher Wheel Sets with model number WH-7850 C24CL sold for road racing bicycles. The rim has labels that read "Shimano WH-7850", "Dura Ace", and "Carbon 1380." These wheels are intended for use with high end adult road racing bicycles.

Sold at: Bicycle specialty stores and dealers nationwide from April 2008 through August 2008 for about \$1,300.

Manufactured in: Malaysia

Remedy: Consumers should stop using the bicycles with the recalled wheels, remove the wheels, and return them to their local bike dealer or retailer for a free inspection and repair.

#### **LEAGUE OF AMERICAN BICYCLISTS ROAD 1 CLASS**

The BikeEd program has been developed by the League of American Bicyclists to educate all levels of bicyclists, from kids through licensing bicycle instructors.

Road I is the foundation course which covers safe riding practices, such as:

Scanning and signaling Lane changing Lane positioning Emergency maneuvers Traffic laws Knowledge of bicycles

Road I is a 9-hour course that can be completed in one day. It consists of four hours of classroom instruction discussing safe riding practices, and five-hours of hands-on practice of these skills with on the road skills and parking lot drills.

The class will be taught by two League Cycling Instructor (LCI). The class will be conducted on Saturday, May 16, 2009, at the MSU Pavilion. The class will be conducted from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.



We will need a minimum of nine (9) in the class, and there will be a cost of about \$60. The successful completion of Road I is a prerequisite for becoming a League Cycling Instructor.

## BIKE BITS from the Adventure Cycling (adventurecycling.org)

SNOW GOING—It's that time of year, for some of us anyway, to start thinking about riding in the snow. There'll no doubt be more people braving the elements this winter, what with the recent surge in bicycling's popularity. Here's an interesting article from the Chicago Sun-Times on that very topic. "This was the year of bikes in Chicago-high gas prices and a growing acceptance of bicycling filled the streets with two-wheeled commuters," begins the story. "But now that leaves and cold rain are falling, the bicycle ranks are thinning." But Dave 'Mr. Bike' Glowacz says this doesn't have to happen, and Glowacz, the author of "Urban Bikers' Tips and Tricks," goes on to give advice about how to keep the wheels rolling through the coming months of cold, snow, and ice. 
