MINUTES OF THE TRI-COUNTY BICYCLE ASSOCIATION

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Foster Community Center - Lansing
April 1, 2008

Board members present included Joe Adams, Sue Viele, Linda Antinori, Al Simons, and Herb Drake. Also present were club members Katie Donnelly, Tom Hardenbergh, Lenny Provencher, Janet Weber, and Pat Trudgen.

Reports

- <u>President's Report:</u> Joe Adams, President, called the meeting to order at 6:31 PM. Joe announced that MDOC has invited the TCBA to participate in their 2nd Annual Health Fair. Herb was to look into possible options for our participation.
- 2. <u>Vice-President's Report:</u> Sue Viele announced that the TCBA's annual picnic will be held on Sunday, June 29, at Rayner Park in Mason. The cost will be \$5 per person.
- 3. <u>Minutes/Secretary's Report:</u> Minutes of the March meeting were presented for review by Linda Antinori, Secretary. Grammatical changes to the minutes were suggested and made. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Sue Viele, was seconded by Kris Stairs, and carried unanimously.
- 4. <u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Dick Sulin, Treasurer, presented the Financial Reports for the 2007 fiscal year as well as January 2008 to the Board.  - Level 4 Lenny is ordering mini toolkits.
 - Level 5 Water bottles are in.
 - Incentives will be available for pick up at the April, May, June, and July meetings.
- 7. <u>Summer Tour:</u> Al Simons, Events Director, announced that Summer Tour is ready to go. Sue Viele has purchased the prizes and Joe Adams has the maps ready for printing.
- **8.** <u>Northwest Tour:</u> Northwest Tour has 175 registered riders to date. Joe also has these maps done and Dick Sulin will have them printed.
- 9. **T-Shirt Ride:** Al Simons reminded the Board that seed money for the Laingsburg cops is needed soon.
- 10. WOW Ride: The WOW Ride is set to go.
- 11. Christmas Party: Joe Adams asked Sue Viele to start planning the 2008 TCBA Christmas Party.
- **12.** <u>Chainwheel Chatter:</u> Sue Viele introduced Janet Weber as the new editor of the Chainwheel Chatter and announced that Charla Scheidler would be assisting Janet in the transition period. We wish her the best of luck in her new endeavors.

13. <u>DALMAC Committee:</u> Tom Hardenbergh, DALMAC Committee Chair, announced that the DALMAC Committee had received 13 applications for this year's grants. They have started to review applications and will report to the Board at the May meeting with their recommendations.

Old Business:

Dick Sullen attempted to meet with the Foster Center administration to find out how the TCBA could
possibly help one of their projects through a donation from the TCBA. He will follow through on this

New Business:

- Al Simons announced that our previous insurance carrier had been bought out by a larger insurance
 carrier and has decided not to write liability and accidental medical coverage to bike clubs. The policy
 McKay is offering through West Bend Mutual offers liability coverage while the accidental medical coverage stays with Nationwide through the McKay Agency. Al made a motion to accept the new policies
 at a cost of \$8,436 for all events. Sue Viele seconded the motion and it passed by a vote of 4 ayes
 and 1 nay.
- Dick Sulin wondered if there was a way we reduce the number of Chainwheel Chatters that we receive back as undeliverable. He was to try a better way to track this problem.

Member Input:

• Pat Trudgen is a Leader of Boy Scout Troop 705 in Holt and presented a proposal to the Board for support and materials for a merit badge in cycling. Road I Class

The BikeEd program has been developed by the League of American Bicyclists to educate all levels of bicyclists, from kids through licensing bicycle instructors.

Road I is the foundation course which covers safe riding practices, such as:

Scanning and signaling Lane changing Lane positioning Emergency maneuvers Traffic laws Knowledge of bicycles

Road I is a nine-hour course that can be completed in one day. It consists of four hours of classroom instruction, and five-hours of hands-on and on-road instruction.

The class will be taught by a League Cycling Instructor (LCI). The class could be held on a Saturday in late summer or early fall, perhaps at the Foster Community Center. We will need a minimum of nine (9) in the class, and there will be a cost of about \$50. The successful completion of Road I is a prerequisite for becoming a League Cycling Instructor.

Experienced coaches from LRC and MSU crew programs will guide you. You must be able to swim to take this class.

All Learn-to-Row sessions will take place at the Ryden Boathouse, Grand River Park in Lansing. The course runs from June 7 through July 26. Tuesdays and Thursdays 6-7:30 PM; Saturdays 9:30 – 11 AM.

You are encouraged to attend at least two of the three sessions offered per week.
