Foster Community Center - Lansing June 1, 2010

Board members present included Roger Nelson, Lenny Provencher, Linda Antinori, Kris Stairs, Pat Trudgen, Donovan Riley, and Dick Sulin. Also present were club members Katie Donnelly, Janet Weber, Bill Savage, and Steve Leiby.

President Roger Nelson called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Reports:

- 1. <u>Vice-President's Report</u>: Bill Savage and Tim Potter will speak on their experiences at the National Bike Summit in Washington, D.C. at the June meeting. Steve Leiby and company will present on DALMAC preparation at our July meeting.
- 2. <u>Secretary's Report:</u> Linda Antinori presented May's Minutes to the Board for approval. Kris Stairs made a motion to accept the Minutes with corrections, Lenny Provencher seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.
- 3. <u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Dick Sulin presented May's Financial Reports to the Board for approval. National Bike Summit Washington, DC, March 9-11, 2010

In January I got a call from Lenny Provencher asking if I would like to represent TCBA at the Summit. With relish, I accepted and made the necessary arrangements; registration, airline reservation and lodging.

Arriving at JFK Airport at about 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 9, I proceeded to the Metro ticket machine and found John Lindenmayer at the next machine. Excited that I ran into someone I knew, I promptly left my briefcase on the floor.... and wheeled my suitcase to the train. I realized my loss when I got off the Metro at my hotel (minus a camera, and other nice things).

At 5:00 p.m. I attended the "First Timers Orientation" and found, to my dismay, that we were there to be 'unpaid lobbyists', and would be visiting the Michigan Senators and Representatives on Thursday. We were instructed to urge them to support "Complete Streets", the Transportation Act and to belong to the Congressional Bike Caucus. We were urged to stick to these issues, and not talk about 'health care', 'wars' or 'tax increases'.

There were 13 Michigan delegates at the Summit, in addition to John and myself. There were TCBA members Tim Potter and Rory Neuner, John Waterman and Wes Grose from PEAC, and several from various bicycle shops in Michigan. We were surprised to also have with us Dan Kauppi and Aaron Rogers, from the Copper Harbor Trails Club, located at the northern most tip of Michigan.

Wednesday was a day of 'Breakout Sessions'. There were several good sessions during each 75 minute time period. I chose to attend "Progressive Cities", "Promoting Livable Communities", "The Madison Story" and "Complete Streets". Every session was excellent!

Next, at 5:00 p.m. all 770 of us met in the Amphitheater to plan our "friendly attack" on Congress on Thursday. It was like a political convention with state signs waving in the air. Our meetings with the congressmen had been previously arranged. The times of each meeting were announced, and who would speak at each meeting what should be said was determined.

Thursday, <u>The Big Day</u>, we set out armed with our weapons (florescent bicycle pins). First, all of us met with Senator Levin's staff people and then with Senator Stabenow's staff. Thereafter, we broke into smaller groups to meet with our own Representatives. Those of us from the Lansing area met with the staffs of Mark Schauer and Mike Rogers. For the most part we were very well received, and was exemplified by the large number of the very popular 'bicycle pins' being worn by the end of the day.

Nationwide, 217 Representatives and 22 Senators now belong to the Bike Caucus. Six Michigan Representatives and no Senators belong to the Bike Caucus, with notable local members Republican Peter Hoekstra and Democrat Mike Schauer.

Thursday evening was the Congressional Reception where we were able to mingle with Congressmen and staff. It was a crowded affair, highlighted by a <u>very pro-bike speech</u> by Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood.

Friday morning I packed the bags I had left, and headed to the airport for my noon flight home. Tim Potter was our lone local member to participate in the Congressional Bike Ride to the capitol. He is prominently shown on the steps of the capitol on page 10 of the April "American Bicyclists" magazine.

TCBA has a 40 years history of DALMAC, and during that time has contributed about \$900,000 to bicycle related causes, including trails, safety, education, and bicycle advocacy. This coming year we expect to reach the million dollar mark. We are a volunteer club and all this money has been raised by volunteers. We are making a difference for bicycling.

We need volunteers to step up and run for office. There are 7 board positions; President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Events Director and two Board-at-Large positions. Elections are in October, but we need a slate for the September meeting.

The Board of Directors meets once a month at 6:30 p.m., usually on the first Tuesday. The meeting is usually over by 8:30. A summary of duties for the board are as follows:

President – is chairperson of the board and has authority for the general and active management of the Association; shall preside over all membership meetings, and present a report of Association activities at the annual membership meeting.

Vice-President – acts in the President's absence and performs other duties delegated by the President. Currently, the Vice-President has been scheduling speakers and/or presentations for the general meetings.

Secretary – records and files the minutes of the meetings and prepares and conducts elections of Directors.

Treasurer – has control of and is responsible for the funds and financial records of the Association and delivers an annual accounting at the annual membership meeting.

Events Director – prepares and conducts the annual DALMAC bicycle tour and delivers monthly reports and an annual report to the Board of Directors.

Board at Large – (2 positions) There are no specific duties, but they have full voting rights as members of the Board of Directors

In addition, the Officers of the corporation are charged with duties and authority as usually pertains to such offices in a corporation.

These jobs are important. We work together and help one another as necessary. We have an accountant to help the treasurer. Our current treasurer is not running again, but he is willing to help and train someone who will take over and considering the size of our budget being treasurer with our Association would probably look pretty good on a resume.


