Board members present included Roger Nelson, Lenny Provencher, Patricia Trudgen, Linda Antinori, and Donovan Riley. Also present were club members Steve Leiby, Katie Donnelly, Janet Weber, Wendell Proudfoot, Deb Holdcraft, John Bach, Tim Potter, and Oren Kennedy.

President Roger Nelson called the meeting to order at 6:40 p.m.

#### **REPORTS**:

- <u>Vice-President's Report</u>: Our Annual Swap Meet is scheduled for the April 29 meeting, and the
  presentation of awards to the winners of tour Bicycle Safety Poster contest and the DALMAC Fund
  Grantees are scheduled for our May meeting. Al Simon is tentatively scheduled to speak on the eastern portion of his cross country bicycle trip in June. We are still looking for a July speaker.
- <u>Secretary's Report</u>: Linda Antinori presented March's Minutes to the Board for approval. Lenny Provencher made a motion to accept the Minutes, Donovan Riley seconded it, and it passed unanimously.
- 3. <u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Dick Sulin presented March's Financial Reports to the Board for approval. Linda Antinori made a motion to accept the reports as written, Donovan Riley seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously. Pat Trudgen made a motion to approve our IRS Form 990 as prepared by our CPA, Linda Antinori seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. Dick was also to look into the cost of upgrading his computer.
- 4. <u>Event Director's Report</u>: Pat Trudgen announced that we have received 1,800 applications for DAL-MAC and that the Quint is almost full. All sites have been nailed down and Donovan is facilitating 2 separate classes for Ride Leaders and SAG Drivers.

The cost is \$100 each for 2 small banners and \$150 each for 2 large banners. Linda Antinori made a motion to approve the funding, Donovan Riley seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.
- Lenny Provencher made a motion to allow the TCBA name to be used as supporter of the Complete Streets Project, Dick Sulin seconded the motion, and it passed by a vote of 4 ayes and 1 abstention.

100,000 Metre T-Shirt Ride ~ Saturday, June 12, 2010, is your opportunity to enjoy one of the best bike rides in Michigan. TCBAs 31<sup>st</sup> Annual T-Shirt Ride is one you don't want to

miss. This year's ride begins at the Laingsburg High School. Riders have three routes to choose from: 25K (17 miles), 50K (34 miles), and 100K (62 miles) loops. All routes start out together with each one splitting off at different mileage points to form its particular loop. Routes use rural Shiawassee County roads and merge together for the last 5 miles back to the starting point. For the ambitious riders opting for 100K, you will travel through Vernon, Byron, and Morrice. For those wanting a 50K spin through the countryside, you will enjoy much of the same moderately rolling terrain. There is also a 25K route geared for families with younger riders and those who aren't quite ready for the longer routes.

#### Lansing Receives National Recognition as a Bicycle-Friendly Community

On May 3, 2010, the City of Lansing and Walk & Bike Lansing! Held a news conference in front of Lansing City Hall to announce that Lansing received the Bronze award as a Bicycle-Friendly Community through the League of American Bicyclists' (LAB) Bicycle-Friendly Community Campaign.

The Bicycle-Friendly Communities (BFC) program is an award program that recognizes municipalities that actively support bicycling.

Lansing's application was compiled during the winter of 2009/2010 by Lansing resident Lyndon Babcock, a r e t i r e d e n g i n e e r a n d longtime bicyclist who has been an active member of Walk & Bike Lansing since its inception in 2006.

The bronze level designation puts Lansing on the map as a bike friendly city, and shows where additional improvements are needed.

Welcome to the 4th annual Northwest Tour, scheduled June 16-20, 2010.. This ride is sponsored by the Tri-County Bicycle Association (TCBA).

It is our sincere hope that each of you will have a wonderful experience riding the Northwest Tour. On Wednesday, we have a short 'dinner' ride to Glen

Arbor. The tour begins on Thursday with two nested loops toward the east. These are 54 miles to Traverse City and 34 miles through Lake Ann. There is an optional extended route of 46 miles to Old Mission Point for the long route. Friday has a pair of nested loops to the south through Honor. The 58-mile long route then passes through Benzonia and Frankfort. The 30-mile loop turns northwest

out of Honor. Both loops then go to Empire.

Saturday's routes travel to the north. The 82-mile

loop goes to Northport, with an optional 23-mile round trip to Leelanau State Park. The 38-mile loop turns south after Little Traverse Lake. Sunday's 29-mile route goes along the Sleeping Bear Dunes National Seashore. This includes an optional ride on Pierce Stocking Drive and the Dune Climb. There is a \$5 daily fee for these attractions.

Name of Product: Bicycle frame.

Units: About 750.

Manufacturer: Niner Bikes of North Hollywood, California.

**Hazard:** A welding deficiency can cause the bicycle frames to crack along the welds of the front triangle of the bicycle. This can cause the rider to lose control and crash.

Incidents/Injuries: Niner Bikes has not received any reports of injuries. The company has received 53 reports of cracks along the welds while bicycles were in use.

**Description:** The recalled bicycle frames include all Jet 9 models ranging sequentially from serial numbers P8001682 to P9400454. The frame is a full suspension model in the colors green, white or black. "Jet 9" and "Niner" are painted on the bicycle frame. The frame was made from 6000 series aluminum.

Sold at: Bicycle stores nationwide and overseas from March 2008 through September 2009 for \$1,750.

Manufactured in: Taiwan

Remedy: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled frames and contact Niner Bikes for a replacement.
