Board members present included Lenny Provencher, Patricia Trudgen, Linda Antinori, Donovan Riley, and Kris Stairs. Also present were club members were Steve Leiby, Katie Donnelly, and Ken Hendricks.

Vice-President Lenny Provencher called the meeting to order at 6:34 p.m. in President Roger Nelson's absence.

Reports:

- Acting President's Report: Possible speakers for March's club meeting are Dick Janson on self contained touring or Joe Krowzenski on his new book, and our Annual Swap meet would be held at the April 29 meeting.
- 2. <u>Secretary's Report:</u> Linda Antinori presented January's Minutes to the Board for approval. Pat Trudgen made a motion to accept the Minutes, Dick Sulin seconded it, and it passed unanimously.

SMART CYCLING: TRAFFIC SKILLS 101

The Smart Cycling program has been developed by the League of American Bicyclists to educate all levels of bicyclists, from kids through licensing bicycle instructors.

Road I (now called Traffic Skills 101) is the foundation course which covers safe riding practices, such as:

Scanning and signaling Lane positioning Traffic laws

Lane changing **Emergency maneuvers** Knowledge of bicycles

Road I is a nine-hour course that can be completed in one day. It consists of four hours of classroom instruction, and five-hours of hands-on and on-road instruction.

The class will be taught by a League Cycling Instructor (LCI). The class is scheduled for Saturday, May 22 at the MSU Pavilion, Room B from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. We will need a minimum of nine (9) in the class, and there will be a cost of \$55.

The successful completion of Road I is a prerequisite for becoming a League Cycling Instructor. It is the hope of the TCBA to get enough members interested and trained to qualify for their LCI which would allow us to continually provide these classes to the rest of the TCBA membership.

We held this class last August where the TCBA members who participated enjoyed a good overview of classroom instruction with adequate hands-on practicing of the basic skills. The class concluded with a road test.

TCBA NORTHWEST TOUR 2010

Tour, scheduled June 16-20, 2010... This ride is sponsored by the Tri-County Bicycle Association (TCBA).

It is our sincere hope that each of you will have a wonderful experience riding the NorthWest Tour. On Wednesday, we have a short 'dinner' ride to Glen Arbor. DALMAC 2010 - Route Info

Construction season has started already. I've been reviewing the County Road Commission web sites to see what they have in store for our DALMAC routes this year. Things aren't as bad so far as they have been in recent years. I'll be contacting the Road Commissions that have construction projects that could affect DALMAC.

A few of the projects are for resurfacing the roads. Some will be done before Labor Day. Other projects are more serious. There are two major bridge replacements that have caused route changes.

The first bridge project is right in our back yard. The bridge on Dobie Road between Kinawa and Hatch Road is to be replaced between June and October. This was the 4 Day East route of last year. This year we'll use the newly rebuilt Farm Lane to go north. The other bridge project affects the 4 Day West. The bridge on Woodruff Road north of Weidman will be replaced from August to November.

Last year I marked in your map booklets where the road surface was bad. I'll do it again this year. I don't expect many of those places to be repaired. I didn't look at all of the roads this year, so if some of them have been fixed, consider that a bonus. If not, be cautious in those areas.

As you know, there is a Quint Century this year. Ida and I checked the route and it looks very good. You'll be riding some roads that haven't been on DALMAC before. The Wednesday and Sunday routes are the same as Thursday and Sunday on the Quad last year. Thursday goes to the West Shore Community College. You'll cross the Hardy Dam, ride through Fremont, Hesperia and Hart, then head north to the college campus. On Friday, your day starts by looping through Ludington and then north to Bear Lake followed by Thompsonville and Frankfort High School. Saturday you ride east from Frankfort to Interlochen. Last year's route up "Puke Hill" is next followed by the balance of the 2009 route to the YMCA Camp.

The 5 UP goes to Sault Ste. Marie on Sunday. It's a nice ride up Mackinaw Trail. After your ride

is over, there is a lot to see and do in town (if you have a ride.) There are the Soo Locks and the St. Mary's River. The Kewadin Casino is about a mile from the high school. It should be a refreshing change for the end of DALMAC 2010.

Start training and get in shape. I'll try to keep track of construction on our routes and report again if problems arise.

MICHIGAN RIDE OF SILENCE

If you know of a cyclist who has been injured or killed while riding, please take special note of this event. On



May 19, 2010, from 7-9 p.m., the worldwide Ride of Silence (ROS) will be held.

The Ride of Silence is an event held to honor and memorialize cyclists who have been injured or killed while on public roadways, and aims to raise the awareness to the public that cyclists have a right to the public roadways. The ride is a silent, slow paced procession, suitable for all skill levels, and there are no registration fees. There are 300+ events worldwide, with 31 locations statewide, two of which are in the immediate coverage area of TCBA: one ride covers the East Lansing/MSU/Lansing area, and one ride is in Haslett.

Riders are requested to wear a

black armband if memorializing a fatality, and/or a red armband if they have been the victim of a collision. Helmets are also required. General public is quite welcome to join in the procession.

The Lansing/MSU/East Lansing event will gather at the MSU Bike location (canoe dock) at 6:30, and will travel to the State Capitol Building at 7:00. A chance to provide a memorial statement is available on the Capitol steps, and we are working on getting a shuttle provided for those who do not wish to ride back to MSU. Cyclists are also requested to use lights, as it often gets dark by the time the event ends.

The Haslett event will start and end at the Haslett Middle school, and will also gather at 6:30. 
