Vice- President Ray Bailey presided over the meeting in President Roger Nelson's absence. Also present were club members Katie Donnelly, Wendell Proudfoot, Jeff Dillingham, and Jean Brailey.

Vice-President Ray Bailey called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Reports:

Correspondence: Pat Trudgen received a note from Sue Riley thanking club members for their consideration and caring after Donovan's recent passing.

Minutes: Secretary Linda Antinori presented February's Minutes to the Board for approval. Pat Trudgen made a motion to accept the Minutes as presented, Ray Bailey seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.

BAGGAGE RESERVATION REQUIRED

This is a class Z ride: "rides over 40 miles in length to be ridden at the riders own pace without on the road ride leader supervision." Riders must be self sufficient, as no SAG support will be provided. The campground at the Gratiot County Fair Ground offers open grassy camp sites. Camping fee is \$10 per tent for each night. This year festival entry tickets are \$15 each day. If you would like to stay in an Alma College dorm room, check out the festival site at http://www.almahighlandfestival.com/house_meals.htm.

Many varied festival activities are available with the peak on Saturday. The return ride early on Sunday morning allows us to avoid the worst of the holiday traffic.

Food is each individual's responsibility. Restaurants are available within walking distance. Riding up, we stop at the Middleton Diner for lunch and riding back we stop there for breakfast. On Saturday, May 28th Alma College offers a splendid breakfast at the Hamilton Commons on campus 6:30 to 8:30 AM. Last year the cost was \$7.

RIDE OF SILENCE

On May 18, 2011, we'll form up at the MSU Bikes Service Center on the North bank of the Red Cedar River, just west of Farm Lane. Meeting time is 6:30 pm to get your arm band(s), sign-off on the waiver, hear instructions and other pre-ride information. We'll proceed to MSU Beaumont Tower at 6:45 and roll-off at 7pm sharp in silence with police escort to MI's State Capitol.

Suggested ride for additional mileage is to park your vehicle at the

Capitol and ride the river trail to MSU Bikes, arriving there at 6:30 p.m. to participate. As with all TCBA rides, helmets are required; lights and bright reflective clothing are highly recommended for the ride home.

Beginning in 2012, the TCBA Board of Directors voted to establish the third Wednesday evening in May – annually, will exclusively have one official TCBA club ride. That ride will be the International Ride of Silence (www.rideofsilence.org) that occurs globally at 7:00 p.m. The event will be free and riders will proceed to the State Capitol. This global event honors cyclists who have been injured or killed, raises awareness that we are here, and to ask that we all SHARE THE ROAD.

FAREWELL TRIBUTES TO FORMER TCBA MEMBERS

We would like to make a farewell tribute to two former TCBA members who have recently passed.

On February 13, 2011, we lost Ron Sprinkel, the founder of a great community program, Share-A-Bike. Ron was 80 years old.

Mike Egan, who is also a TCBA member, volunteered with the Share-A-Bike program. Mike is in East Lansing because of Sprinkel's involvement with Project Pride. Egan said Sprinkel noticed many bicycles being dropped off at Project Pride.

The all-volunteer program, begun in 1994, operated out of the Bailey

Community Center for one year before moving to its present location -- a trailer behind East Lansing Fire Station 1.

"Ron was and is the reason we are in the city of East Lansing," Egan said. "He was always quick to say he wasn't a mechanic, but he took good care of the program."

More than 600 bikes have been given away the past three summers, which Egan said cements Ron's legacy of helping people meet their transportation needs.

We also lost Art Chappell who was 95 when he passed on March 26, 2011. Art, the father of our current member, Rebecca Baughn, is re-

membered by some of our TCBA members as "the gent with the gorgeous white beard".

Art and his wife Grace, used to host the TCBA Hayrides at his farm on Shoeman Rd. in Haslett. In addition, Art and his wife, also appeared as Mr. and Mrs. Santa at the several TCBA Christmas parties.

Our heartfelt condolences go out to the families of Ron Sprinkel and Art Chappell. We appreciate everything you both did to better our communities and the TCBA club. We will miss you both.
