**MINUTES OF THE TRI-COUNTY BICYCLE ASSOCIATION
BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
Foster Community Center - Lansing
July 5, 2011**

Board members present included Roger Nelson, Ray Bailey, Steve Leiby, Linda Antinori, and Dean Brailey. Also present were club members Bill Savage, Katie Donnelly, and Wendell Proudfoot.

President Roger Nelson called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m.

Reports:

Minutes: Secretary Linda Antinori presented the June 7, 2011 Minutes to the Board for approval. Steve Leiby made a motion to approve the minutes with corrections; Ray Bailey seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

President's Report: Roger Nelson gave a short report on the Lion's Club Kid's Day in Holt in which he took part in as a TCBA representative. He also said that he had made contact with Jim Blair of the group Friends of the River Trail which is no longer in operation. John Chamberlain who owns the Lansing River Boat is trying to revive the group.

Vice-Presidents Report: Ray Bailey announced that we are still in need of ideas for speakers at our August, September, and November meetings. We will have our Annual DALMAC presentation for our July meeting. If anyone has an idea about what they would like to see, please contact Ray.

Secretary's Report: Linda Antinori reminded those in attendance of the upcoming Board elections in October and the need for candidates.

Treasurer's Report: Steve Leiby presented June's Financial Reports to the Board for approval. Ray Bailey made a motion to accept the Report as presented; Dean Brailey seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Summer Tour: Summer Tour is ready to go with 184 registered riders and crew.

DALMAC Fund: Steve Leiby of The DALMAC Fund Committee asked the Board for permission to shift the approved funding for CATA from bike racks to bike loops as CATA can garner Federal funding for the bike racks and not the loops. Linda Antinori made a motion to shift the purpose of CATA's DALMAC Grant to the purchase of bike loops, Ray Bailey seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

T-Shirt Ride: The T-Shirt Ride took in \$5,000 and had 375 riders of whom 97 were pre-registered.

Membership: Dean Brailey reported that we were mailing 757 copies of the Chainwheel Chatter.

Old Business:

- Steve Leiby contacted the Mayor's office about our wish to help maintain the River Trail. He was referred to the acting Parks and Recreation Director, Brett Kaschinske, who expressed interest in working with us. The City is repairing the area at Moores River Drive this summer, but the trail needs work on the north end.

New Business:

- Linda Antinori presented the meeting schedule for 2011-2012 to the Board for approval. Dean Brailey made a motion to accept the calendar as amended, Steve Leiby seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
- Leon Puttler asked the Board for permission to place a notice for Bath Days which includes a bike ride on August 6 in the Chainwheel Chatter. Non-bicycling events are not allowed to advertise in the Chainwheel Chatter but we will add a Facebook link for this event.
- Wendell Proudfoot, club member, proposed a change in the family membership which is now 2 adults plus dependents up to age 21. He proposed that we abandon the age requirement and deliver just one newsletter to each household. The Board tabled the matter until its next meeting.
- Steve Leiby asked the Board permission to draft a letter from Roger to MDOT encouraging the addition of bike facilities at its park and drive lots.
- Ray Bailey brought up the subject of allowing rides outside of the Tri-County area to be eligible for credit in the Ride Incentive Program. The matter was tabled until the next Board meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.

Smart Cycling – Traffic Skills 101 Class
Saturday, October 8, 2011
MSU Pavilion – Room A

A "Smart Cycling – Traffic Skills 101" Class will be held at the MSU Pavilion from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The class will be taught by League Cycling Instructors (LCI's) and other experienced TCBA members. This may be the last class before offering a LCI during the Summer of 2012.

The course will cover: Safe Riding Practices, Scanning and Signaling, Lane Changing & Positioning, Emergency Maneuvers, Traffic Laws, Knowledge of Bicycles & Bicycle Maintenance.

Approximately four hours will be held in the classroom, and four hours outdoors developing riding skills such as Scanning, Emergency Stopping, Quick Turns, and avoiding obstacles on the road.

EXPERIENCE THE WHITE PINE TRAIL

Come join Jan and Tony Koller to experience this delightful trail, on the west side of the state. The White Pine trail is about 90 miles long but we will ride the paved section, from Comstock Riverside Park to Sand Lake, about 45 miles round-trip. If you wish to ride more, bring a mountain bike.

Meet at Riverside Park off Monroe street south of N. Park road on Saturday Sept 10 a "Z" ride from Comstock Riverside Park starting @ 10 o'clock. Distance is 47 miles on the White Pine trail. We will ride from Riverside Park to Sand Lake and back on paved trail. Rain date is Sept.11. Food stop will be available on the route.

DIRECTIONS: From Lansing, take I-96 westbound. Leave highway at exit 33 for the Mich 44 Connector/Plainfield Ave. Make a right onto MI 44 Connector/Plainfield Ave NE. Turn right onto 3 mile Rd NE. Then, turn right onto Monroe Ave. NE with a quick left into the parking lot. We will be at the northernmost parking lot, away from the river, to accommodate boaters. Look for DALMAC flags.
