TRI-COUNTY BICYCLE ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

April 2, 2013, Foster Community Center, Lansing, Michigan

President (Pat Trudgen) called meeting to order at 6:38 p.m.

Roll Call: Present and constituting a quorum: Patricia Trudgen, Steve Leiby, Ray Bailey, Julie Bailey, Joel Wickham, and Heidi Vanator. Absent: Bill Smith. Others in attendance: Dwayne Scheidler, Katie Donnelly, Jeff Dillingham, Bob Lovell, Dave Pierce, Mike Unsworth, Linda Antinori, and Steve Schuesler.

Board approved the agenda: Ray Bailey motioned to accept the agenda, with Heidi Vanator seconding with one correction of Katie Donnelly's last name.

Minutes from March 5, 2013 meeting were reviewed, with Joel making the motion to accept, and Steve Leiby second it with addition of last month motion of Steve to accept and Joel seconding it.

Correspondence received: Steve Leiby received a pamphlet from Kalamazoo River Valley Trail which he passed around for the board.

BOARD REPORTS:

President Patricia Trudgen: Ride of Remembrance usually takes place the first of May. Ride was started by Lenny Provencher, and headed by Rebecca Baughn for the last 2 years. Rebecca is now asking for someone to head the ride and she will work with them. Pat said she needed to know by the 10th of April to get information in the *Chain-wheel Chatter*.

Secretary Julie Bailey: no report.

Treasurer Steve Leiby: Steve told the board that Accountant LaBell and Rice completed our exemption forms. He discussed the financial reports. Board accepted the treasurers report, motion made by Ray Bailey, and 2nd by Heidi. Motion carried.

Events Director Heidi Vanator: Heidi discussed the progress of the video of Dick Allen. Final taping next month because there are four more things Bob Bishop wants on tape. Promotion for DALMAC is going well. Told us the web page is being revamped, and the DALMAC Facebook page is running. DALMAC Registrations are rolling in, approximately 1,100 applications are in. Pat asked about the video if they needed more material still, and the response was yes. Steve asked his wife to get him the bills that started DALMAC. Pat asked Heidi if she has the ride leader of the year plaque. Heidi said the email about it went to her spam, but she now has it ordered.

Board-At-Large Ray Bailey: no report

Board-At-Large Joel Wickham: Joel said he got a call from Velocipede Peddler about members who submitted a request for a jersey for ride incentive. Some sizes and colors are not available at this time because of the end of the year. Winter product is what is available now. So if we ordered in November, it would have been fine. No Royal Blue and no XXL. Joel stated we own the design. We will accept the jerseys and then have them silk screened. Ray Bailey suggested that we contact those people affected, and ask them if they want to wait till June for jerseys, or drop down to another category.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

National Bike Summit Bob Lovell: Bob attended the meeting and the theme was: *Bicycling Means Business*. Ms. Cade from AAA was a speaker, and said bikers must learn and follow safety rules! This is held in Washington each year, and the second day was for lobbying. Lobbying in Levin's office went well.

Insurance Dwayne Scheidler: Dwayne made an outline about coverage due to an accident last year and explained it to the board. DALMAC needs to buy the insurance for liability when renting vans. Pat is going to get with Cheryl and Ron about registering drivers for SAG vehicles and baggage trucks.

Pat told us that the storage unit was broke into two weeks ago. Pete Derkos has to go through the stuff, and see what is missing. Police report was taken. Another lock has to be purchased. This was tabled until next month to learn what is missing.

Advocacy Committee Mike Unsworth: Mike will email a copy of the report to the board tomorrow. He said they are investigating a bike friendly business. Steve Leiby and Mike are drawing up a policy about starting a new committee to work on bike parking and miscellaneous. They are finalizing the route for Ride of Silence, and hope to be done next week. Mike would like to use the letterhead banner for the 11th Ride of Silence. Ray motioned to use letterhead, and 2nd by Joel (Motion Carried). There is a big project on Waverly Road-reconfiguring the bridge over the river, and condensing for bike lanes. April 8, 2013 is Lansing Township Meeting, and they need someone to attend to be the voice. Mike handed it over to Bob Lovell to talk about the Dinner and Bikes 2013. He asked if TCBA would support the event up to half of the \$500. TCBA would only be on the hook for the \$250 if they didn't sell any tickets. The church will seat 100, and the meal will be Vegan Gluten Free. Event will be May 6th. Motion made by Steve Leiby, and 2nd Heidi to support this event up to \$250.

Ride Incentive and Club Jerseys Joel Wickham: Still have 2 Ride Incentive Committee Documents out there. Motion made by Ray Bailey, and 2nd Steve Leiby to bring ride incentive forward with no change. Member said it was put in and it was inappropriate to have two different rides at the same time and same location.

DALMAC Heidi Vanator: Heidi stated that Mike and Mike will not be driving trucks back this year. Pat reminded Heidi that she needs to tell Cheryl Claflin.

T Shirt Ride Steve Schuesler: Steve talked about the design and the cost would be a maximum of \$200-\$300. Joel Wickham asked if they had the logo yet, and Steve said no. He said it will be fine if we have the T-shirts in hand by May 1st. Dwayne said Steve S. already has the money to spend, and no need to ask board.

DALMAC Fund Steve Leiby: Steve said the committee had their meeting, reviewed requests, and sent them to bidders. By the next board meeting he will bring a report to the board.

OLD BUSINESS:

Protocol Pat Trudgen—Information that should be in the Board minutes monthly has been researched by Jeff Dillingham. Pat will meet with Julie this month and try to simplify the minutes and report back to the Board next month.

Computer Business: Pat was contacted pertaining to Joe Adams' computer, which was purchased in 2009. He got a virus and the computer crashed. Joe gave an itemized bill of what it cost to get it back up and running. Total \$769. No receipts, so the board will be asking for them. Pat stated the only thing we were doing tonight is putting it out there, so we can read it, mull it over, and make a decision next month.

Ride Leader for Alma Ride Joel Wickham: Club gave \$100 to run this ride for the last couple of years. He asked if we would again approve \$100, receipts required, to cover the Highland Festival May 24-26th. A motion was made by Ray Bailey funding up to \$150, and 2nd Heidi Vanator.

PA System Jeff Dillingham: Jeff asked if the club had any reason to purchase one because he could use it for the Northwest Tour. Member said TCBA had one and donated it to the Foster Center. Jeff will look for one and get a quote. Steve Leiby said Jeff has been building his EMPIRE, and will have money left.

INPUT from members. NONE

Ray Bailey moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Steve Leiby. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:27pm.

TCBA Advocacy Committee Report for April

- I. Capital Bike Share (CBS)-- CBS is close to having an agreement with A2B Bikeshare (<http://a2bbikeshare.com/>) for a pilot program beginning in August and ending in October. It will involve roughly 40 bikes and 20 bike stands centered along a Michigan Avenue backbone. If the pilot results are favorable, CBS hopes for an April 2014 rollout. CBS is exploring funding options
- II. Business Likes Bikes —An informational workshop was held s on April 17 to the Westside Commercial Association to a positive reception.
- III. Bike Parking—Steve and Mike have completed work on key elements of the program; it will be presented to the May TCBA meeting
- IV. Waverly Road/Nonmotorized Pathway Project (Mike) – It looks like Lansing Township and Ingham County are at loggerheads over funding over the part of the project in their shared jurisdiction. The City of Lansing apparently will be working the areas that it controls.
- V. Ride of Silence--Things are moving along for this May 15 event.
- VI. CATA Transportation Center Public Info. Session (AKA the new Amtrak Station)—This session was devoted to options on the overall site layout. These options were designed to be conceptual, i.e., to spark reactions. Several committee members attended and shared their comments on e-mail.
- VII. Operation Soft Serve—Elaine Meyer has volunteered to be the new coordinator; Kalamazoo St. construction updates—There will be intermittent closures on pathway portion of the River Trail
- VIII. Bogue St. Bridge reconstruction near campus – The City of East Lansing is submitting a grant proposal for this project. TCBA sent a letter supporting bike/pedestrian features

LOOKING FOR A NEW MAP MAKER

Last fall I notified the TCBA board that as of the completion of the 2013 DALMAC, I would no longer be doing routes and maps for the club. I have done this job for 20 years. The board has asked me to provide a description of my job so that it will give the prospective replacement some idea about what is involved.

The work involves various parts: route selection, create cue sheets, route review, building base maps, fleshing out the maps, map review, cover creation, printing.

DALMAC is mostly static. There are a few changes that are needed each year. Summer Tour moves every year, so new routes are needed. NorthWest Tour also has a few changes each year, but mostly stays the same. The Women On Wheels and the 100,000 Metre T-Shirt rides don't normally change except for the date of the ride. The TCBA Crosstown booklet has updates about every 3 years. The Lansing Area Maps (the Blue Book) doesn't get changed unless there is a need.

For a new route, I first create the route using my "route bible", the Michigan County Atlas by Universal Map. The road names are transferred to cue sheet tables to discover the total mileage. The route is then reviewed for usability. The base maps that are available from the State of Michigan web site are used to create a usable base to add the map details (fleshing out). When the map is done it must be reviewed for accuracy. Create the cover, if needed. Get the maps printed. This process can take a number of hours to a number of days depending on the complexity of the map. In the case of the 2013 DALMAC booklets, there are 113 maps, plus text pages and covers. Fortunately for the new map maker, these are all done and will be provided.

I have used Gladstone Printers for years. I have a good working relationship with them.

I currently use a computer with Windows XP and 4 Gb of memory, Adobe Illustrator CS 4, MaPublisher 8. I use a laser printer and an inkjet printer. Illustrator is the main worker in the map making process. MaPublisher is an add-on that converts the base maps so they can be used in Illustrator.

Other software that I use in conjunction with preparing routes and maps include: Microsoft Streets and Trips (to set and measure routes), Google Earth (to look at road surfaces and to measure routes) and Bing Maps (to look at road surfaces). Also, I set initial routes via the Michigan County Atlas by Universal Map (see above). The pages are flat, so I don't know about hills. It also shows road surfaces. It allows me to prepare routes before I do a road trip to verify that the road is usable by our riders.

The person who takes on this job will need to have some computer skills to allow them to understand and use the software. I am prepared to work with this person to help them get started in the map making process and to help learn the software.

I use the road trips to verify that the roads I have seen in the Google or Bing satellite images are in fact usable. This part of the process may be done by another person. I choose to do both the road work and the maps so that I am sure there are no problems.

MEMBERSHIPS

On May 2, 2013, we have 1056 members in 604 Individual and Family memberships. Sixty six memberships have elected to receive their Chainwheel Chatter newsletter exclusively on-line. In March and April, 40 memberships expired without renewal (as of May 2, 2013). In April, we had 27 renewals, 17 new memberships and 24 paid their dues online using PayPal.

Would you find it convenient to get an e-mail reminder when your membership is due for renewal? Registering on the on-line membership system will "auto-magically" get you a reminder. You needn't renew your membership immediately. If you register indicating that you are a current member, I will enter the information for your renewal, and your current membership status.

If you'd like to forgo receiving the newsletter in the mail, and receive an e-mail each month when it becomes available on the website, please register using the on-line system and indicate your preference. If you'd like to both get the e-mail and the mailed copy of the newsletter, you can do that too.

We are using two systems for membership management right now. The on-line system is basically automated, although data from the Access database has to be entered manually. The memberships registered on-line are duplicated in the Access database which is used for the mailing list. The on-line system is used to manage the list of members who don't wish to receive the newsletter in the mail.

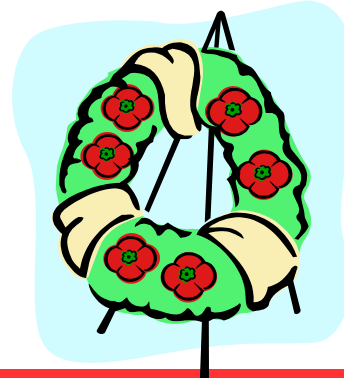

We found lot's of dirt roads we had never seen on a bicycle. When we lost a truck driver for DALMAC just before the ride, Art and Grace said, sure we can do that. Grace soon had all the drivers meeting for lunch and many friendships made. Grace started the tradition of getting in to camp early and identifying the go-to person at the school and giving them a DALMAC t-shirt. Then she would make sure we were well cared for. She checked us into the dinner line and played cribbage and cards with riders who didn't mind losing ...(12 years). Art and Grace also played Santa and Mrs. Claus at TCBA Christmas parties, making sure every child received a gift and love. No fake white beard found with Arthur, they really fit the parts ...(10 years). For about 20 years in their 70's and 80's they supported TCBA any way they could.

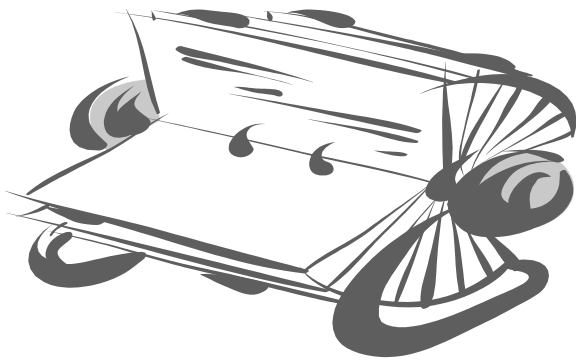
