1. President (Patricia Trudgen) called the meeting to order at 6:35pm.

2. **Roll Call**

Present and constituting a quorum: Patricia Trudgen, Bill Smith, Steve Leiby, Heidi Vanator and Joel Wickham. Absent: Julie and Ray Bailey. Others present: TCBA Club members Steve Schuesler, Katie Donnelly, Wendell Proudfoot, and Lenny Provencher.

3. Board approved the agenda. J. Wickham motioned to accept the agenda, B. Smith seconded. Motion carried.

4. **Minutes** from February 5, 2013 meeting were approved.

5. **Board Reports:**

President: Pat gave a brief report. P. Trudgen received an inquiry from a gentleman in Traverse City wanting to place an ad in the Chainwheel Chatter. Ad's can be placed by TCBA members.

Vice President: Bill Smith gave a brief report which included up coming club meetings and events. It was determined that there will not be a swap meet at the April Club meeting. TCBA Advocacy Committee Report for March

- A. Bike Share activities:
1. A2B Bikeshare, a firm out of Ann Arbor, had a demonstration of their Alpha model on March 23. Several of our committee members attended and gave suggestions.
 2. The Tri-County Regional Planning Commission approved a \$75,000 grant for the City of Lansing to purchase bike share infrastructure for FY 2014-15. The Ingham County Land Bank has promised \$20,000 for bike share infrastructure.
- B. Bike Friendly Business—a subcommittee of Lynn Martinez, Rory Neuner, and Nancy Krupiarz are drafting a concept document which details the benefits of attracting bicycling consumers.
- C. The March 7 quarterly Tri-County Regional Transportation Forum was on the topic “Complete Streets: What’s Next?” Over 30 people attended, about half were officials of local communities. There was a good sharing of information.
- D. Bike Parking:
1. The Tri-County Regional Planning Commission approved a \$40,000 grant for the City of Lansing to purchase bike racks for FY 2013-142013
 2. Steve Leiby and Mike Unsworth continue their work on the details of the stipulations for participating organizations.
- E. Lansing Area Ride of Silence (May 15) – Work continues on finalizing the route and publicity. **OK to use letterhead**
- F. Waverly Road/Nonmotorized Pathway Project—this important project which affects the City of Lansing, Lansing Township, and Ingham County was discussed in detail at the March 19 County Service Committee. No action was taken.
- G. “Dinners & Bikes 2013” tour—Bob Lovell is working with the East Lansing Food Co-op on hosting a dinner which will discuss bike commuting and local foods.
- H. Tim Potter & Mike Unsworth gave a presentation on “Making the MSU campus bike friendly” at the annual Michigan Traffic Safety Summit sponsored by the Michigan State Police

Riders must be self sufficient, as no SAG support will be provided. The campground at the Gratiot County Fair Ground offers open grassy camp sites or camping in a covered animal show ring. Smart Cycling – Traffic Skills Class Saturday, May 25, 2013 MSU Pavilion – Room A

A “Smart Cycling – Traffic Skills” Class will be held on May 25, 2013, at the MSU Pavilion from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. The class will be taught by League Cycling Instructors (LCI's) and other experienced TCBA members.

The course will cover: Safe Riding Practices, Scanning and Signaling, Lane Changing & Positioning, Emergency Maneuvers, Traffic Laws, Knowledge of Bicycles and Bicycle Maintenance.

Approximately four hours will be held in the classroom, and four hours outdoors developing riding skills such as Scanning, Emergency Stopping, Quick Turns, and avoiding obstacles on the road.

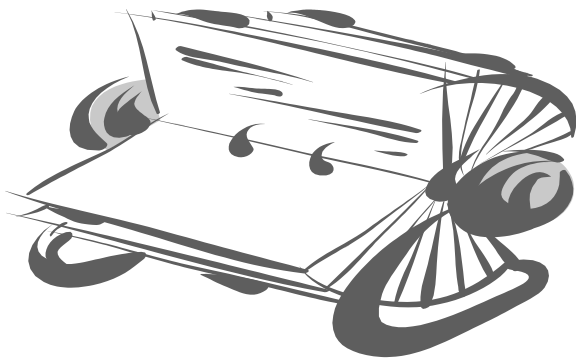
