**FEBRUARY 2014
ADVOCACY COMMITTEE REPORT**

Ride of Silence Planning

Our goal is to get 200 riders for the May 21st event. Consequently, much of our efforts will be devoted to publicity.

U.S. Housing & Urban Development (HUD) work plan for Non-Motorized Transportation (NMT)

- The Winter meeting was on Feb. 27 and was devoted to pedestrian issues.
- The Spring meeting will be in April or May; its focus will be to identify connections for trails, pathways, and bike routes in the Tri-County Region.
- Updating of the county maps continues. Once completed, area transport planners will have an up-to-date aid in identifying cycling activities and needs.

Bike Parking

- The Bike Parking Subcommittee is drafting an application form that businesses and other groups would submit to get TCBA aid in providing bike parking.
- The City of Lansing will be compiling a bike rack census that will start with Lansing locations and on to non-Lansing locations. For the latter, it will be relying on information from outside people and groups.

MDOT-related Hot Spots

Committee members are communicating its concerns to MDOT about the Intersection of North US 127 & French Road (north of St. Johns) and the dangerous situation created by continuous centerline rumble strips on two-lane state highways.

Michigan Avenue/Grand River Avenue planning charrettes.

The final report was released in a public meeting on February 26 (<http://migrand-charrette.com/>). It deals with the future development and configuration of a corridor that stretches from the State Capitol building to Webberville. Steve Leiby attended an implementation meeting on February 27.

CATA Bus Rapid Transit (BRT)

The Capital Area Transportation Authority is trying to get federal funding for a proposed BRT line from downtown Lansing to the Meridian Mall. As part of the process, CATA will be holding open meetings in March and April (<http://cata-brt.org>). If implemented, the BRT buses would be designed for bikes to be carried internally.

Regional Infrastructure Developments

- The Meridian Township Planning Commission approved a Special Use Permit for a separate bike/pedestrian bridge over the Red Cedar River on Okemos Road.
- Delhi Township has begun pathway construction and is building a bridge over Sycamore Creek.
- Michigan Trails & Greenways will fund an engineering study that would connect the pathways of the City of Mason and Delhi Township by designing a tunnel under US-127.

SMART CYCLING - TRAFFIC SKILLS 101 CLASS

A “Smart Cycling – Traffic Skills” Class will be held on May 17, 2014, at the MSU Pavilion from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. The class will be taught by League Cycling Instructors (LCI’s) and other experienced TCBA members.

The course will cover: Safe Riding Practices, Scanning and Signaling, Lane Changing & Positioning, Emergency Maneuvers, Traffic Laws, Knowledge of Bicycles and Bicycle Maintenance.

Approximately four hours will be held in the classroom, and four hours outdoors developing riding skills such as Scanning, Emergency Stopping, Quick Turns, and avoiding obstacles on the road.

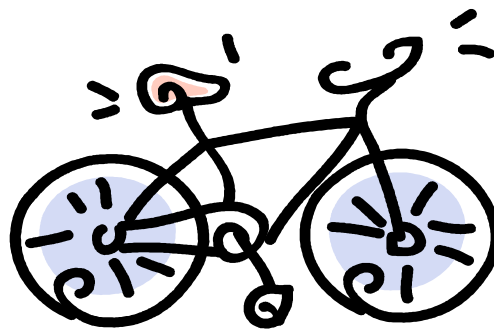

U.S. CONSUMER PRODUCT RECALL

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with the firm named below, today announced a voluntary recall of the following consumer product. Consumers should stop using recalled products immediately unless otherwise instructed. It is illegal to resell or attempt to resell a recalled consumer product.

NAME OF PRODUCT: Spyre and Spyre SLC dual-piston mechanical disc brake calipers.

HAZARD: The brake cable actuator arm can over-rotate, dislocating parts, causing the brake calipers to fail. Lack of brakes results in loss of control and a crash hazard, posing a risk of injury to the rider and others.

REMEDY: Consumers should immediately stop riding bikes equipped with the recalled brake calipers and return the calipers to the original place of purchase or Tektro USA/TRP for a free replacement with an improved version.

UNITS: About 2,000.

DESCRIPTION: This recall includes Spyre and Spyre SLC dual-piston mechanical disc brake calipers sold as original and aftermarket equipment in 2013. Spyre calipers have a black anodized caliper body and a silver actuator arm with "Spyre" on it. Spyre SLC calipers have a polished aluminum caliper body and a black composite actuator arm with "Spyre SLC" on it. Recalled calipers have a fastening screw with a hollow six-pointed star-shaped head with no markings on it and a 3 millimeter pad adjust screw on the outward side. The recalled calipers were also sold as original equipment on bicycles manufactured or distributed by BTI, Diamond Back Bicycles, Giant Bicycles, Hans Johnson Co (HJC), Kona, Marin Bikes, Quality Bicycle Products, Raleigh America.

INCIDENTS/INJURIES: Tektro USA/TRP has received one report of a brake caliper failing in this manner. There have been no reports of injuries or property damage.

SOLD AT: Retail bicycle shops nationwide and online at universalcycles.com, tektro-usa.com and trpbrakes.com from April 2013 to December 2013 for about \$90 for the Spyre caliper and about \$110 for the Spyre SLC caliper.

COURT RULING COULD THREATEN BIKE TRAILS LAND USED FOR RAILROADS GOES BACK TO OWNERS

WASHINGTON The Supreme Court's ruling in a Wyoming land dispute Monday, March 10, 2014, could result in the loss of thousands of miles of bicycle trails or cost the government millions of dollars in land payments and legal bills.

The justices ruled 8-1 that government easements used to build railroads on public and private property in the West expire when railroads go belly-up, and the land must revert to its owners.

Chief Justice John Roberts, writing for the majority, said the case was decided based on an 1875 act of Congress and a 1942 Supreme Court decision involving Great Northern Railway.

That ruling said the government had received easements without any long-term land rights, Roberts said. "We're going to stick with that today," he said.

The decision could jeopardize the "rails to trails" program that has created more than 1,400 bike and nature trails, many of them build along railroad rights-of-way. It prompted a lone dissent from Justice Sonia Sotomayor.

"The court undermines the legality of thousands of miles of former rights of way that the public now enjoys as means of transportation and recreation," she said, adding that lawsuits "may well cost American taxpayers hundreds of millions of dollars."

The ruling came in a case brought by Wyoming landowner Marvin Brandt, whose 83-acre property is crossed by an old railroad line that had been converted to a bike trail inside Medicine Bow National Forest. Brandt's victory has implications for about 80 other cases involving more than 8,000 claimants.

The Rails to Trails Conservancy had warned a loss would block the Medicine Bow Rail Trail and "threaten existing rail trails across America that utilize federally granted rights-of-way," including some in Colorado, Idaho, South Dakota and Washington.

The government could keep trails open by paying off land-owners, said Kevin Mills, senior vice president of policy and trail development for the conservancy.

"There probably will be an increase in litigation," he said. "At a minimum, it creates uncertainty and/or expense."

During oral arguments in January, Justice Stephen Breyer, who has had three bicycling accidents since 1993, said landowners could be besieged by bikers.

"I certainly think bicycle paths are a good idea," Breyer said. But "for all I know, there is some right-of-way that goes through people's houses, you know, and all of a sudden they are going to be living in their house, and suddenly a bicycle will run through it."
