NEW HAND SIGNAL APPROVED

On January 28, 2014, Governor Rick Snyder signed into law the option for bicyclists to extend their right arm horizontally to signal when they make a right turn. Prior to this legislation, we would have to use our left arm in the form of an "L" to signal the right turn.

Representative Anthony Forlini, R-Harrison Township, sponsored the bill indicating most drivers were unfamiliar with the traditional right-hand turn gesture.

So, whichever signal you prefer when making right-hand turns, please, just signal to afford drivers the opportunity of seeing what we are intending to do when we are on the roads.

JANUARY 2014 ADVOCACY COMMITTEE REPORT

Discussion with TCBA President Darryl Burris on the activities of the Advocacy Committee

Since is the first TCBA president who had not been involved in the Board's discussion on establishing the Advocacy Committee, we invited him to the January meeting to discuss priorities & operations of TCBA in general and the Advocacy Committee in particular.

U.S. Housing & Urban Development (HUD) work plan for Non-Motorized Transportation (NMT)

The Winter regional meeting, scheduled for late February, will be devoted to walking/pedestrian issues. The theme and work of the Spring meeting (sometime in April) is "Making Connections." Nancy Krupiarz and several volunteers are fine-tuning a master map of the Tri-County area that shows NMT infrastructure (trails, bike lanes, pathways, bike routes, etc.) to insure that descriptions match reality. The Spring meeting will prioritize projects that connect existing facilities. A finalized map with a listing of the priorities will be a valuable tool for governments and the Tri-County Regional Planning Commission when they work on future projects.

2014 Ride of Silence

Planning will begin in early February for this May 21st event.

Bicycling "Hot Spot"

Darryl described the dangerous situation at the intersection of North US 127 & French Road (north of St. Johns) near the "Hitching Post" restaurant in Clinton County.

Inaugural Meeting of Pedestrian and Bicycle Committee of the Michigan Department of Transportation's University Region

On January 29 over thirty people representing a variety of governmental and other groups meet at the MDOT offices in Jackson to discuss ways to improve bicycle and pedestrian safety. The goal of these quarterly meetings is to share information about a variety of topics: best practices, lessons learned, upcoming projects, new approaches, successes, etc.

Steve Leiby and Mike Unsworth represented TCBA while TCBA members Nancy Krupiarz, Rory Neuner, and Tim Potter attended in other capacities. TCBA was the only bicycle club invited that attended the meeting.

After the meeting, Nancy Krupiarz and Steve Leiby had a detailed discussion with MDOT officials about the dangerous intersection of North US 127 & French Road.

U.S. CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with the firm named below, today announced a voluntary recall of the following consumer product. Consumers should stop using recalled products immediately unless otherwise instructed. It is illegal to resell or attempt to resell a recalled consumer product.

Name of Product: Cervélo P5 bicycles with 3T Aduro aero handlebars

Units: About 1,300 in the US and about 225 in Canada

Importer: Focus Bicycles USA, Carlsbad, CA.

Hazard: The forward extension mounts can detach from the base bar while riding causing the rider to lose control, posing a risk of injury.

Incidents/Injuries: 3T Design has received 28 reports of incidents, including one report of a broken collar bone and four reports of abrasions

Description: The recall includes 2012 and 2013 Cervélo P5 bicycles equipped with 3T Aduro aero handlebars. The bicycles are black with red and white stripes. "P5" is on the seat tube, "Cervélo" is on the top tube and a large "é" is on the down tube in white lettering. The handlebars consist of four major components: a base bar, which attaches to the bike; a forward extension mount, which attaches to the base bar; forearm rests and forward extension bars, which attach to the forward extension mount. The base bar is black with red and white stripes and has "3T" on the top and rear. The handlebars come with both a high and a low forward extension mount, one of which will be installed based on customer fit. Consumers can purchase an ultra-low forward extension mount separately. The words "Ultimate Performance" are on the forward extensions. The handlebars were manufactured between January 2012 and July 2012. Serial numbers for the handlebars are on a label inside the base bar under the stem cap on the rear wall. The serial number is the seven-digit number following "FM78-Basebar-." The manufacture date code is the first four digits of the serial number in the MMYY format. Date codes for the defective handlebars range from 1201 to 1207. P5 bicycles which have already been inspected and passed at retailers are distinguished by a green sticker with an "é" on the underside of the Aduro base bar.

Manufacturer: 3T Design Ltd., of Hong Kong. Manufactured in China.

Remedy: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled bicycles and contact 3T Design to have the recalled handlebars replaced free of charge with a modified set of Aduro aero handlebars installed with the high or low mount. Consumers who also purchased the ultra-low mount can receive:

- a full refund for the ultra-low mount and a free modified Aduro aero base bar for use with the originally purchased low mount or
- replacement of the Aduro aero handlebars with 3T Mistral aero handlebars with a low-position mount, which places a rider in a position similar to the Aduro ultra-low position mount.

Name of Product: Folding Bicycles

Units: About 4,600.

Hazard: The bicycle's frame can break during use, posing a fall hazard to the rider.

Incidents/Injuries: West Marine has received three reports of the bicycle's frame breaking, resulting in bruises and scrapes to a rider.

Description: This recall involves two models of folding bicycles, the Jetty Express 2 and the Port Runner 2, that are designed for use in and around docks and marinas. The Jetty Express 2 has a blue and white frame and folds at a hinge in the middle. Jetty Express 2 is printed on the bike's frame. The Port Runner 2 has a red frame and folds at a hinge in the middle. Port Runner 2 is printed on the bike's frame.

Manufacturer: West Marine Products, Inc., of Watsonville, CA. Manufactured in China.

Remedy: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled bicycles and return them to West Marine for a free replacement folding bicycle.

Name of Product: SRAM Hydraulic Road Rim Brakes and Hydraulic Road Disc Brakes for bicycles.

Units: About 25,350.

Hazard: The brake systems can fail, posing a crash and injury hazard.

Incidents/Injuries: The firm received 95 reports of brakes failing in the U.S. One minor injury was reported in the U.S. and another in Australia.

Description: The recalled bicycle brake models include SB Red Hydraulic Road Disc, SB Red Hydraulic Road Rim, SB 700 Hydraulic Road Disc and SB 700 Hydraulic Road Rim, used as either front or rear brakes. The SB RED brake lever is labeled "RED" on the body of the lever assembly. The SB 700 brake lever is labeled "S-Series" on the body of the lever assembly. The serial numbers for the recalled brakes have the digit "3" as the fourth digit of the serial number. The serial number can be found on the bottom of the caliper body. The brakes were sold as aftermarket products and as original equipment on the following bicycle brands and models:
