RIDE OF SILENCE FOR JILL BYELICH

On behalf of the organizers of The Ride of Silence Tribute for Jill Byelich on October 5, 2014, here is an update of this TCBA Club Ride that occurred. The cycling community expresses their thank you to TCBA for its participation in the event.

Following the tragic crash which killed Jill Byelich on September 2nd, (misdemeanor charges involving cell phone usage by a motorist are in the Clinton County court system), TCBA became a sponsoring organization through its Advocacy Committee with other partners to assist with this ride, as an official club ride.

Approximately 150 persons participated in various ways along the 5-mile, 8-mile, and 16-mile ride. Law enforcement provided an escort through the duration from Wacousta to the Capitol. Jill Byelich's family, including husband Jordan, and sons ages 4 and 6 also completed the section of the ride past the crash site to the cemetery. Additional information on the full details and media coverage are easiest to find on Facebook - search for Jill Byelich - the event page with updates is there.

With approval of Mr. Tom Hardenbergh, here is an excerpt from those postings, that Tom wrote:

With great gray clouds sliding along dramatically on a cool autumn day and the line of cyclists ready to depart, I could not speak the words in my head. So, I will say them here.

We are here today in our great numbers to ride in remembrance of Jill Byelich. We ride in silence to allow our thoughts to rest with Jill and her family and to calm our broken hearts.

While Jill has gone on that great ride none of us ever return from, we are still here; here today, here tomorrow, here always to enjoy the activity we love so much and to demonstrate our right to do so.

We ask for a blessing on this ride. Watch over us and keep us safe today, tomorrow, and always. May we all take care and live aware.

Additional thoughts from the author: Why some folks do the advocacy stuff...

For me it began in 1976 when charter TCBA Member Tom Hardenbergh scraped my bike and I to the side of the road and kept other vehicles from running into me after a Waverly School Bus did a swipe/hit & run to me on the morning commute. Tom's words to me as the ambulance closed in were, "Get a Helmet Kid"... I went through a couple of Bell Bikers, but also got involved in the TCBA & Lansing Safety Council Helmet Lending Program in the era with Bill & Diane were running the TCBA Safety & Education Committee.

Over the years, various non-motorized advocacy topics have come and gone, and currently the opportunity to affect better infrastructure design has never been better. As I look at another cycling –v- motorist fatality in Hudsonsville, just two days after our Ride of Silence Tribute for Jill Byelich, I recalled and herein paraphrase comments made by Jill Byelich's husband. Jordan. at his wife's gravesite Sunday, "the 66 foot right-of-way belongs to all of us to use as we see fit and we all deserve access without hindrance or dangers caused by others in this space"

It was the most succinct reason I have seen to focus on improving safe and rightful access that I have seen, whether the cycling is for primary transportation, recreation, and/or vacation touring.

CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION PRODUCT RECALLS

NAME OF PRODUCT: Louis Garneau Aerodynamic Bicycle Helmet

HAZARD: In cold temperatures, the helmet can fail to protect the wearer from impact injuries.

REMEDY: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled helmets and return them to Louis Garneau USA for a refund or replacement with a similar helmet.

UNITS: About 1,180 helmets.

DESCRIPTION: This recall involves Louis Garneau P-09 aerodynamic bicycle helmets with model number 1405362. The helmets are shaped like tear drops with a rounded front and a short tapered tail. The outer shells of the helmets are made of polycarbonate and have a built-in visor system, dimples on the top like those on a golf ball, a small rectangular vent in the front and a triangular vent in the rear. The helmets came in three color schemes: black with red and white designs, white with blue and gray designs, and white with silver and white designs. The word "Garneau" is located on both sides of the helmet and the Louis Garneau logo is on the front under the fent. Recalled helmets have the manufacture date "Jan 2014" on a sticker inside the helmet.

INCIDENTS/INJURIES: None reported.

SOLD AT: Independent bicycle dealers nationwide and online at Louisgarneau.com from January 2014 through September 2014 for between \$280 and \$350.

IMPORTER: Louis Garneau USA Inc., of Derby, VT.

MANUFACTURED IN: China.

NAME OF PRODUCT: Orbea Avant Bicycles

HAZARD: The bicycle front fork can crack, posing a fall hazard.

REMEDY: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled bicycles and contact Orbea for a free replacement and installation of the bicycle front fork.

UNITS: 715

DESCRIPTION: This recall involves all Avant bicycles and carbon framesets sold with hydraulic disk brakes and all Avant bicycles and carbon framesets that are capable of being configured with hydraulic disc brakes. The model numbers are not marked on the bicycles and there is also no color or gender designation. The word Avant is in black or white on the top and head tube of the frameset and the word Orbea is in white on the top and down tube of the frameset.

INCIDENTS/INJURIES: None reported.

HAZARD: The front wheel on the bicycle can detach, posing a fall hazard.

REMEDY: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled bicycles and contact Dynacraft to arrange for a free repair.

UNITS: About 3,100

DESCRIPTION: This recall involves 20-inch Avigo Turn N' Burn youth bicycles with model number 8107-62. The nodel number and date of manufacture, "08202013," are printed on a data label on the frame's seat tube. The bicycles have a silver frame, blue handlebars and black front fork with blue accents, hand brakes and a kickstand. The serial number can be found etched on the frame on the underside of the bottom bracket shell. Serial numbers included in the recall have letters: "DJFH" followed by a six-digit number between 026588 and 027104, and between 089533 through 090562; or the letters "DJFI" followed by a six-digit number between 015107 and 015552, and between 100093 and 101193.

INCIDENTS/INJURIES: Dynacraft has received one report of a consumer who fell and sustained scrapes and abrasions when the front wheel detached.


