September 2015 Advocacy Committee Report Submitted by Mike Unsworth

Bike racks have been delivered to Bath Township.

Mike Unsworth recently met with Andy Kilpatrick, City of Lansing Traffic Engineer, and discussed non-motorized transit (NMT) issues. Here are the highlights:

- The River Trail as a NMT corridor-- From a utilitarian standpoint, the Trail is often not the most direct route for traveling the City. Thus there is a need a for a comprehensive NMT network which comprises of neighborhood streets (including bike boulevards), shared lanes, bike lanes on higher volume streets, and pathways. All elements should be connected, just like our road network.
- Michigan Avenue reconstruction will take place in both 2017 & 2018.
 - Andy is planning on producing a bike infrastructure map which would show the boulevards, bike parking, and other features.
 - The City invited us to help them plan and mark bike/pedestrian detours for events, such as Common Ground
- Lansing's downtown parking lots and structures will get more bike parking & bike lockers. They will be administered by the Parking Office.
- The University Region of the Michigan Department of Transportation has produced its Regional Non-motorized Plan, dated July 2015. At this time, an electronic version of the Plan and maps can be found at the website created for this project, http://www.uregionnomoplan.com/, listed under "Documents and Maps." Plan specifically The final pdf for the is located at http:// www.uregionnomoplan.com/#!docs-maps/cfvg. This website will continue to be active until August 2016.

DAI MAC 2015

Labor Day 2015 saw the completion of the 45th DALMAC, www.dalmac.org. This year's team implemented several changes. Among them were:

- o An online Primal Team Store providing different types of clothing options;
- Changes in the 5 West and 5 East routes;
- o Menu changes at some of the overnight stops in an effort to improve our food offerings;
- Sheriff monitored controlled crossing at the intersection of Williamsburg and M-72 on the 5 West route:
- o Two posters;
- DALMAC sponsored presence on Facebook;
- o Availability of digital DALMAC route maps;
- o Ability to purchase bus tickets to East Lansing at the end of DALMAC

Although there were changes made in some of our menus, this year's rider survey indicates we need to continue with this effort. The Food and Facilities Committee is working on that objective. For next year, we are looking at more changes:

- Continue to improve food menus;
- o End the 5 UP route closer to St. Ignace rather than in Sault Ste. Marie;
- o Possible change of the 5 West 3rd day route between McBain and Elk Rapids;
- o Develop a list of commercial stops along DALMAC routes for riders;
- o Required viewing of a bicycling safety video prior to registration

Since DALMAC began in 1971, the more than 100 dedicated volunteers who plan and support DALMAC each year have continued to produce one of the premier bicycle tours in the Country. I want to thank ALL of those volunteers for their outstanding service to our riders. If anyone would like to join our group of DALMAC volunteers, please send an email to volunteers@dalmac.org. 2015 DALMAC registered riders and crew - These numbers include 18 riders under the age of 13 and 6 riders over the age of 80.

Our oldest rider was Harry Denman on the 4 Day West at age 90. Dick Allen. age 82 rode his 42nd DALMAC with Ted Bosley, age 89, both from Ithaca, MI on the 5UP.

Daylight Saving Ends



It's time to fall back!

Daylight Saving ends at 2:00 AM on Sunday, November 1, 2015.

Credit for Daylight Saving Time belongs to Benjamin Franklin, who first suggested the idea in 1784. The idea was revived in 1907, when William Willett, an Englishman, proposed a similar system in the pamphlet *The Waste of Daylight*.

The Germans were the first to officially adopt the light-extending system in 1915 as a fuelsaving measure during World War I. The British switched one year later, and the United States followed in 1918, when Congress passed the Standard Time Act, which established our time zones. This experiment lasted only until 1920, when the law was repealed due to **opposition from dairy farmers (cows don't pay attention to** clocks).


